MAOFP offers an annual scientific poster competition during our Winter Family Medicine Conference. Residents are invited to present original research or case study posters. Cash prizes are awarded.

Faculty and residents are invited to submit lecture topics to be considered for MAOFP's conferences and articles for our publications.

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### **On-Demand Educational Lectures**

### ***Mentor Program***

# MEMBERSHIP DUES

Membership is available to each residency program's director, core faculty and residents. Core faculty is defined as physician faculty members who have a significant role in the education of residents, have documented qualifications to instruct and supervise, and devote at least 15 hours per week to resident education and administration.

Dues are calculated based on the number of residents and directors/core faculty in your program. The program is available to osteopathic and allopathic programs and individuals. The program membership period runs from August to July annually.
